Arlington ISD – Public Service Endorsement Pathways

A. A student may earn a Public Service endorsement by completing 26 credits, the requirements specified in subsection (e) [requirements in foundation plan plus a fourth credit in mathematics and a fourth credit in science], and a coherent sequence of courses for four or more credits in CTE that consists of at least two courses in the same career cluster, including at least one advanced CTE course, which includes any course that is the third or higher course in a sequence. Courses may be taken in any order as long as prerequisites and grade level requirements are met. The final course in the sequence must be from one of the CTE career clusters listed in the following:
