Section 551.083 - For the purpose of considering the standards, guidelines, terms or conditions the Board will follow, or instruct its representatives to follow, in consultation with representatives of employee groups in connection with consultation agreements provided for by Section 13.901 of the Texas Education Code.

Section 551.084 - For the purpose of excluding a witness or witnesses from a hearing during examination of another witness.

**Subject:** Temporary Amendment to Policy DEC (Local)

**Purpose:**

To discuss a temporary amendment of Board Policy DEC (Local) for the 2021-2022 school year due to the continued impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic.


**Background:**

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) provided paid sick leave to regular employees who were unable to work because the employee was quarantined pursuant to a federal, state, or local government order or advise of a healthcare provider, and/or experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and seeking a medical diagnosis. FFCRA expired on December 31, 2020. The AISD Board amended the policy in August of 2020, for the remainder of the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

Because current conditions related to the COVID-19 Pandemic are still uncertain, and the number of cases are increasing, consideration to amending policy DEC Local is presented. Amending the policy will offer additional paid leave to District employees who have a positive diagnosis of COVID-19 and are required to quarantine to reduce exposure in the workplace.

**Recommendation:**

Administration recommends the Board temporarily amend Board Policy DEC (Local) to allow paid leave for employees who have a positive COVID-19 diagnosis for the 2021-2022 school year.

**Resolution Temporarily Amending Policy DEC (LOCAL)**  
***DRAFT***

WHEREAS, the U.S. Government has declared a national emergency and the State of Texas has declared a statewide disaster regarding the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, and;

WHEREAS, Texas Education Code 11.151 gives the Board of Trustees the exclusive power and duty to govern and oversee the management of the public schools of the District, and;

WHEREAS, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) provided additional paid leave due to COVID-19 symptoms and seeking a medical diagnosis, and;

WHEREAS, the FFCRA expired December 31, 2020, and;

WHEREAS, the pandemic continues and Arlington ISD believes it is in the best interest of the District that those who test positive for COVID-19 should not be at work;

WHEREAS, all district employees, contractual and at-will, contribute to the achievement of the educational mission of Arlington ISD, and;

WHEREAS, paying all employees for time missed because they are sick due to a positive COVID-19 test will enhance morale, reduce employee turnover, and reduce District exposure to unemployment or workers' compensation claims, and;

**BE IT RESOLVED:**

That the Board of Trustees amends for the 2021-2022 school year Board Policy DEC (LOCAL), effective immediately, to provide as follows:

This policy amendment applies to any employee who provides evidence of a positive COVID-19 test result shall be placed on paid leave immediately for the equivalent of ten calendar days:

Full-time employees shall be paid for the days they are on paid leave at their regular rate of pay for those days on paid leave. Part-time employees shall receive pay for the number of hours of paid leave that the employee works on average over that same period.

The Board reserves the right to reconsider or amend this resolution as needed.

#### MARKET RECAP - JUNE 2021:

At this point, nearly everyone who wants a vaccine has been able to receive one, and while new strains continue to pop up it seems that vaccines by and large provide a high level of protection. Covid restrictions are becoming more and more relaxed with most of the United States "open" or at least partially open. As the country returns to normalcy this summer, we should continue to see the economy improve.

The ISM manufacturing index rose from 60.7 to a two-month high of 61.2 in May. The ISM non-manufacturing (service sector) index rose from 62.7 in April to 64.0 in May, the highest reading since the survey started in 1997. Nonfarm payrolls missed the mark for the second month in a row, increasing by +559k, which in a pre-pandemic world would be huge, but the median forecast was +675k and we're still 7.6 million jobs below last year's pre-pandemic peak. The unemployment rate dropped from 6.1% to 5.8% in May, but the drop was the result of 166k Americans exiting the labor force during the month as the labor force participation rate slipped to 61.6%. Average hourly earnings climbed +0.5% in May after a +0.7% jump in April. These are significant single month increases as employers must pay more to find and retain workers. Retail sales took a breather in May, declining -1.3%, but upward revisions boosted April's previously reported unchanged reading to +0.9% and March's already lofty +9.8% gain was increased to +11.3%. Recall that March and April sales were boosted by the last round of government stimulus, so a pullback in May was expected. May's decline doesn't change the fact that consumer spending has been on a torrid pace. The total value of retail sales was \$620.2 billion in May, an +18% increase over February 2020's pre-pandemic level. On the inflation front, the headline consumer price index rose +0.6% in May while core CPI climbed +0.7%. On a year-over-year basis, headline CPI was advancing at a +5.0% pace, *the biggest annual increase in almost 13 years*. Core CPI rose +3.8% year-over-year, the most since 1992. Much of the year-over-year gains can be attributed to the "base effect" as prices were severely depressed 12 months ago while many U.S. businesses were shuttered. The base effect will dissipate going forward, but shortages of materials and labor promise to keep prices high for much of the year. Estimates for second quarter GDP growth center around +10%. Fiscal and monetary stimulus, combined with pent up demand and consumers eagerly returning to pre-pandemic habits, mean the summer should see substantial growth.

The Fed made no official change to policy at its June FOMC meeting, holding rates steady and maintaining the monthly addition of \$120 billion to its balance sheet. However, the FOMC did signal they will discuss tapering these QE purchases soon. The updated "dot plot" showed Fed officials expect initial rate hikes earlier than previously indicated with 13 of 18 Fed officials now envisioning at least one hike in 2023. The FOMC also made two technical adjustments, increasing the interest on excess reserves (IOER) rate from 0.10% to 0.15%, and the overnight reverse repo rate from 0% to 0.05%. The IOER hike incentivizes banks to hold higher balances with the Fed while the reverse repo facility allows eligible financial firms and money market mutual funds to place cash at the Fed and earn 0.05%. Both should help to ease overall demand for short-term securities and nudge yields higher. The Fed's action had an immediate effect on yields with the two-year treasury yield climbing from 0.15% to 0.26%. Treasury bills inside of 3 months, which had been trading near 0% were up a few basis points. Longer-term yields have fallen as inflation expectations moderate.

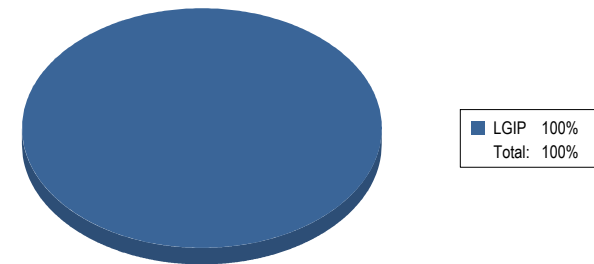

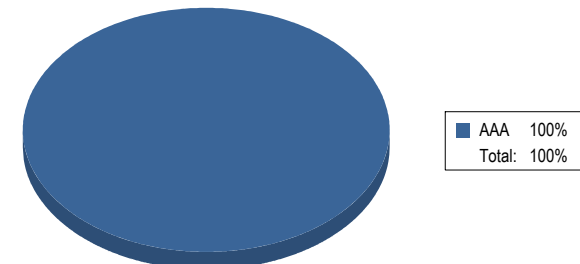
### Allocation by Issuer

A. Consider Preliminary 2021-2022 Budget

Chief Financial Officer Darla Moss presented an update on the preliminary 2021-2022 budget. She reported that the finance team had an opportunity to share preliminary budget information with the Board Finance and Academics Committee and get their feedback. Enrollment drives the revenue for state funding and AISD enrollment peaked in 2012-2013 and has been declining. Property values have been increasing and the final values are expected in July with a potential increase of 5.96 percent. The preliminary budget includes a proposed tax rate the same as the 2020-21 year, however, is likely to be reduced through compression to reduce the burden on tax payers. Some expenses identified as eligible for ESSER III funding, totaling \$5.6 million, have been removed from the preliminary general operating budget. The 2021-22 preliminary budget (which does not include employee salary increase, TASB recommended adjustments, stipend adjustments, new positions or substitute rate increase):

#### DISCUSSION:

- A. Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief III (ESSER III) Fund Plan Update

Chief Academic Officer Dr. Wurtz presented an update on planning for ESSER III funds. School districts must expend a minimum of twenty percent of their grant funds on evidence-based interventions and

ensure the interventions respond to students' academic, social and emotional needs and address the disproportionate impact of the coronavirus on specific student populations. Dr. Wurtz reported that challenges include gaps in student learning, students' social and emotional well-being and re-engagement, equity and sustainability. In order to address the challenges, a cross-departmental task force developed draft considerations and recommendations that were reviewed by campus leaders and teachers for input and feedback, differentiated for various campus needs. Sustainability is prioritized to address both current and long-term student needs, advancement of the strategic plan, building on the district's capacity for when funding ends and implementing the identified strategies effectively and equitably. Academic targets include third and eighth grade proficiency in reading and math aligned with state level STAAR scores, as well as kindergarten readiness and at least one college, career and military readiness indicator. Planning categories for funding are safe reopening of schools, enhanced services, essential needs prior to COVID-19, learner experience, leadership development, equity, professional development, staffing, mental/health needs, instructional materials, facilities and technology. Stakeholder feedback from the cross-departmental team, principals, teachers, survey (participants include parents, staff and community members), Arlington Chamber of Commerce, district departments continues to be included in plan development. Sample strategies for funding include prekindergarten expansion, additional instructional coaches, additional counselors, extended PLC time for elementary, and curriculum resources with lesson exemplars. Capacity building is a major focus as professional learning and growth and development of staff are sustainable for future benefit. For enrollment stabilization, ESSER II funds will be maximized with student registration strategies.

Board members appreciated the support for teachers and classroom instruction. Mr. Wilbanks asked that the Board Finance and Academics Committee be updated on the STAAR score results and learning gaps as soon as possible.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

**DISCUSSION / ACTION:**

- A.       Consider 2021-2022 Preliminary Budget

Superintendent Cavazos announced that the budget discussion would continue and thanked the finance department, department heads and principals for their work. The items the Board requested



during the last meeting were added and this presentation provides an opportunity for the Board to provide direction and guidance for what will be proposed for adoption at the next meeting on June 22, 2021. The Board has received an abundance of information through this process and Dr. Cavazos thanked them for their time reviewing different options for compensation, including substitutes, and other data.

Chief Financial Officer Mrs. Moss presented an update on the 2021-2022 preliminary budget. She reviewed the timeline for adopting the budget, including the public hearing on June 22, 2021. Budget assumptions include an expected property value increase of 5.96 percent (increase is due to the substantial increase in mineral value), tax collection rate of 98.5 percent, maintenance and operations tax rate of \$1.0565 (decrease of \$.0299 based on maximum compressed rate to be provided by TEA in August), interest and sinking tax rate of \$0.3007 (same rate as the 2020-2021 fiscal year), and student enrollment of 56,447. The proposed operating budget presented to the Board includes a four percent midpoint increase for employees, TASB recommended compensation adjustments, TASB recommended stipend adjustments, new positions, substitute pay rate increase and an increase in compensation toward health insurance. The 2021-2022 proposed budgets:

Board members thanked Mrs. Moss and the finance department for their work and keeping the budget priorities front and center. Board Finance and Academics Committee Chair Dr. Reich said that the Board made a decision last year for a four percent raise with a commitment to staff to provide competitive compensation. Voters approved a TRE with the intent of supporting competitive compensation. Based on data from TASB, to keep AISD competitive, the Board asked for a budget proposal to include a four percent employee compensation increase, TASB recommended pay adjustments in different service year bands, a substitute pay increase and a health insurance contribution increase of \$28.

Board members shared their appreciation for employees, noting the importance of the teachers in the classrooms. They expressed support for the proposed four percent employee compensation increase, the recommended adjustments to pay and stipends from TASB, the increase in substitute pay and the increase in insurance contribution. The budget proposal includes potential ESSER funds to support revenue due to enrollment loss. Mr. Wilbanks asked that staff continue to look at the hourly rates of the labor market in the current market. Mr. Hogg asked Mr. Kahl to track the substitute fill rate and certified substitutes for possible additional adjustment, if needed. Mr. Hogg recommended that the Board consider an increase of \$31 to insurance contribution, based on increases in health insurance rates and employee plan options.

President Mays thanked everyone for the discussion and stressed the importance of the priorities that reflect what is important, student success and staff. The budget supports the District goal and strategic plan.

Mrs. Moss reported that the finance team would make the adjustments. AISD has been conservative in the past and is still conservative, not just depending on ESSER funds but also projecting out with the general operating budget. The proposed budget, with the additional calculations discussed, will include a deficit of approximately \$12 million, before the addition of potential ESSER funds to stabilize.

B. Consider Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief III (ESSER III) Fund Plan Update

Chief Academic Officer Dr. Wurtz reported that ESSER II funds of \$59,962,913 assist with enrollment stabilization and ESSER III funds of \$134,688,182 address gap closure. He reviewed the spending requirements, challenges, guiding principles, sustainability planning and academic targets previously shared with the Board. After gathering parent, community, stakeholder and district feedback, funding buckets were considered with dollar amounts. These will be assessed and adjusted over time as appropriate. The draft funding proposal:

- Instructional support \$33,299,941
- Extended day/summer programming \$26,980,351
- Mental health/behavior support \$12,142,667
- Professional learning \$19,613,217
- Technology \$ 7,324,049
- Infrastructure \$35,327,957

Dr. Wurtz reviewed the strategies included in each funding bucket. The staff additions to support the strategies is embedded into each bucket. Baseline staffing supports for all campuses include

instructional coaches and testing facilitators. Every campus will engage in horizontal laser team coaching for ELA and math teachers. Additionally, the proposed ESSER tiered campus support is a financial resource up to \$30,000 per year for basic tier schools, one additional position and financial resource up to \$7,500 per year for essential tier schools, and one additional position and financial resource up to \$15,000 per year for targeted tier schools. This tiered approach provides equity and addresses campus-specific needs.

Administration recommended that the Board approve the ESSER plans as presented.

Board members asked clarifying questions. Mrs. McMurrough asked staff to consider allowing teachers to get a substitute during the work day as they complete part of the reading academy. Mr. Wilbanks asked for additional information regarding the minimum amount of ESSER II funds required for enrollment stabilization and the possibility of applying some of the funds towards learning loss, tutors and other high yield strategies. Mr. Hogg asked for quarterly student outcomes based reports.

DISCUSSION:

A. Legislative Update

HillCo Partners representative Mr. David Anderson presented a review of the 87<sup>th</sup> Legislative Session. For this session there was a unique financial situation as Comptroller Hegar projected a revenue shortfall of \$4.58 billion, however, the day before the session the shortfall was reduced to \$1 billion and an additional \$1.7 billion was added to the revenue forecast in May 2021. The projected budget shortfall did not happen and the session was not about the budget. The session focus changed with the impact of Winter Storm Uri and a top legislative priority of weatherization and preparedness.

Kate Kuhlmann, HillCo Partners representative, reported that good things came from the budget. House Bill 3 was fully funded, as was enrollment growth. There is funding over budget for higher education, funding for higher education financial aid programs, and supplemental special education services. House Bill 1525 provides funding for various student allotments, targeted programs for pandemic affected students and schools, re-establishes the gifted and talented allotment, provides student data protections, reimburses Winter Storm Uri expenses, creates a commission on special education funding, and more. Ms. Kuhlmann highlighted notable bills that address items like organization, accountability and fiscal management, due process and accountability modifications, use of TEA discretionary funds toward accelerated learning, grants program within TEA, a tutoring program, a supplemental special education services program and optional UIL competition participation by home schooled children.

Mr. Anderson reviewed the impact of House Bill 1585, Senate Bill 1444 and Senate Bill 202, all related to TRS legislation. He noted that House Bill 1585 requires attention from AISD staff and Senate Bill 202 prohibits employers from directly or indirectly passing on employer contribution costs to rehired employees. There are unsettled issues that will likely be addressed in a special session. Topics include state assessment policies and practices, virtual education, elections, Chapter 313 extension, charter schools and governance. There has been some governance erosion at the local level and more authority at the state level. HillCo Partners will continue to monitor issues and anticipates possible significant changes in the AISD legislative delegation with redistricting.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Cavazos shared his customary thank you, specifically thanking the board this time. He thanked them for their diligence on the budget and their collective effort that recognizes and validates staff.

#### SCHOOL BOARD'S REPORT:

President Mays reported that we are moving into the weekend that commemorates June 19. On June 19, 1865, two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation was issued by President Lincoln freeing enslaved people in the confederacy, Major General Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas to inform them that slavery had been outlawed. This impacted more than 250,000 enslaved people. The news was openly disregarded by Galveston's Mayor and the enslaved people continued to work as slaves. This is not just about the freedom of enslaved people, but also about a group of people who claimed their rights as Americans, as many continue to do today. It is important for all people to recognize the history of this day because it is an expression of hope and resistance, a balance of the two, for all who continue to seek true freedom. Her son is preparing to start his teaching career and received a minor in history. He talked about how history seemed boring in school, but as he learned more he is able to look back at past impact and determine future ways to make the world better. Mrs. Mays encouraged everyone to do something to learn about or celebrate Juneteenth.

Dr. Reich reported that Juneteenth is now a national holiday. Ms. Opal Lee, marching for years, finally got her way.

##### B. Optional Flexible School Day Program 2020-2021

President Mays opened the Public Hearing regarding Optional Flexible School Day Program 2020-2021 at 7:10 p.m.

Chief Academic Officer Dr. Wurtz presented a report on the optional flexible school day program for the 2020-2021 school year. During the 2020-2021 school year, 258 students were enrolled as *flexible attendance* students at 600 New York completing 1,117 classes. Ten additional students remained on their home campus for instruction. A total of 268 students participated in the Optional Flexible School Day Program. This year 117 of those students graduated. 173 students are currently still enrolled at either the dropout prevention center or their home campus. Eighty-five students have dropped out. Those students are among the most vulnerable students in the district and include students who have completed all course work, but have not passed state mandated tests.

During the 2020-2021 academic year, ninety-three students were enrolled as flexible attendance students at Arlington Collegiate High School participating in the Optional Flexible School Day Program. All these students graduated in June 2021. They were able to participate in a variety of college courses offered during traditional school hours as well as non-traditional hours. The Optional Flexible School Day Program allowed students to participate in non-traditional course times that included evening classes, Saturday classes, and online classes. Students had the flexibility to take courses at Arlington Collegiate High School, the Dan Dipert Career and Technical Center, multiple Tarrant County College campuses, the University of Texas at Arlington, and Texas Wesleyan University. This flexibility helped all students to acquire their high school diplomas as well as allowing most of the class of 2021 to earn their associate's degree.

There were no speakers from the audience, and Ms. Mays closed the Public Hearing at 7:12 p.m.

##### C. Optional Flexible School Day Program 2021-2022

President Mays opened the Public Hearing regarding Optional Flexible School Day Program 2021-2022 at 7:12 p.m.

Dr. Wurtz presented the plans for the optional flexible school day program for the 2021-2022 school year. The Optional Flexible School Day Program may be implemented for students in grades nine through twelve who are at risk of dropping out of school, participating in an approved early college high school plan, attending a state-approved innovative redesigned school, and/or require an alternate academic route due to denial of credit in one or more classes because of not meeting state attendance requirements.

For the upcoming year, AISD will continue to rely on this program for our district's drop-out prevention program, housed at 600 New York, and our Early College High School students as well. In doing so, the Optional Flexible School Day Program will grant students in these transformational programs access to a flexible schedule beyond that of a traditional 180 day / five days per week requirement, including: courses on weekends, night classes, extended day classes, and flexible schedules throughout the year to accommodate courses beyond the traditional 18-week semester. Under the

Optional Flexible School Day Program designation, the school district may receive funding based on the actual time a student is in attendance from as low as forty-five minutes a day to a maximum of ten hours a day. Minutes are accumulated to maximize the average daily attendance (ADA) a student can earn during the twelve-month period. Students must apply to participate. They must meet eligibility requirements and be afforded certified instructors in all educational services for which they are eligible, as well as comply with the appropriate assessments during the regularly scheduled assessment period.

The coaching sessions occur during the school day, between the teacher and coach, when they can dialogue about the instruction.



**Retainer Agreement Between  
Arlington Independent School District

Eichelbaum Wardell Hansen Powell & Mehl, P.C.**

It is agreed that Arlington Independent School District (hereinafter called "AISD" or the "District") and Eichelbaum, Wardell, Hansen, Powell & Mehl, P.C. (hereinafter called "FIRM"), or its successor firm or assignee, do hereby agree to have FIRM represent AISD as its attorneys for a period beginning September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023, on the following terms and conditions:

**BASIC SERVICES AGREEMENT**

AISD appoints FIRM as its agent to take appropriate action, incur expenses, and to employ others to perform necessary services in connection with the general counsel legal services to be performed by FIRM, as identified in the Request for Proposal for General Counsel Legal Services, Bid No. 15-11 ("Request for Proposal"), and which include the following:

**REPRESENTATION**

1. Represent AISD in litigation cases before municipal, county, state and federal courts, subject to limitations and/or exclusions contained herein.
2. Represent AISD in proceedings before special education hearing officers.
3. Represent AISD in employee or student-related proceedings before the Texas Education Agency (TEA), University Interscholastic League (UIL), the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), the Texas Commission on Human Rights, the Office of Civil Rights (OCR), and/or other civil rights enforcement agencies.

**OTHER SERVICES**

1. Act as legal advisors either directly, by telephone, in writing or video conferencing, to the Board, Board committees, the Superintendent, his/her committees, administrators, and principals.
2. Be on call to attend AISD Board meetings, with adequate notice and by request of the Superintendent or Board President.
3. Review and/or assist in the writing of policies, employee or student handbooks and codes of conduct.
4. Conduct workshops or trainings for the Board, administrators, or employees on school-related issues. On request, conduct workshops for parents or students.
5. Assist in reviewing documents, negotiating, and providing other legal assistance in the areas of construction, real estate, and other contractual matters.



6. Represent AISD in litigation, including arbitration/mediation matters, as referenced above. All such matters shall be billed under separate agreement letters.

#### GENERAL COUNSEL

1. FIRM agrees to house an attorney, approved by AISD, at the AISD administrative offices on a full-time basis for as long as this Agreement is in effect. It is understood that this on-site attorney will be designated to be the primary responder to all AISD matters as well as attend regular and called Board meetings. It is also agreed that additional attorneys, subject to AISD's approval, may be assigned to the District as appropriate for particular matters.

2. Initial selection and assignment of the attorney will be done by the FIRM, provided however, such selection and assignment is subject to the approval of AISD.

3. Continued assignment at AISD of the attorney serving as the primary responder will be subject to maintaining a satisfactory working relationship with AISD administration. The assignment of the attorney shall be subject to continued approval by AISD, and at any time during the term of this Agreement, AISD maintains the right to revoke this approval, at which time the FIRM will provide another attorney in order to faithfully perform the services of general counsel as outlined herein. Upon written notice of AISD's revocation of approval for a particular attorney, the FIRM shall immediately make arrangements to fulfill its duties outlined in this Agreement, and shall, within forty-five (45) days, provide a replacement attorney satisfactory to AISD. Should the FIRM fail to provide a replacement attorney satisfactory to AISD pursuant to this paragraph, AISD reserves the right to terminate this Agreement pursuant to the terms outlined in this Agreement. At all times the position of primary responder is vacant, Firm agrees to provide another firm attorney at the reduced rate for the primary responder attorney as noted in Exhibit A.

4. FIRM will perform all of the above duties and undertake all legal representation for no attorneys' fees other than as specified below; with the exception that FIRM will not be required to handle the following matters or any other matter precluded by Rule 1.01 of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct: tax matters, school desegregation matters, asbestos, preparation of corporate documents, corporate business matters (profit or non-profit), issuance of bonds or related bond matters, bankruptcy matters, and criminal law matters. If accepted by FIRM, these excepted matters will be handled at an hourly rate determined on a case-by-case basis and will be addressed under separate agreement.

#### FUNDING AND COSTS

1. In consideration of the general counsel legal services specified herein and in the Request for Proposal, AISD agrees to pay FIRM the current agreed upon billing rates as set forth in Exhibit A, and the costs for out of pocket expenses that apply to those matters.

2. Billable hours include ALL research and preparation, training, consultation, representation, litigation, and travel time on behalf of the District. The primary responder attorney will not charge for travel time or costs within AISD.

3. In addition to the above, AISD agrees to pay directly to FIRM all customary and usual out-of-pocket costs and expenses incurred by any attorney retained by the firm, and previously approved by the District to represent the District, including but not limited to court costs, filing fees, photocopying, long distance telephone, facsimile charges, electronic research, travel expenses, and postage. A copy of the firm's charges for these

expenses is attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein as Exhibit A. These expenses will be billed separately by FIRM.

4. FIRM maintains the ability to advise and request AISD to hire outside counsel to present cases before hearing panels or the Board, or in court, or before the TEA or any other agency or for any other purpose, due to potential or actual conflicts of interest in representing AISD. In the event AISD agrees to hire other outside legal counsel at the request of FIRM, AISD agrees to pay such outside counsel's attorneys' fees and cost.

5. Should FIRM be awarded and collect attorney's fees in any AISD matter, AISD shall receive any fees awarded by the court in the judgment.

#### CLIENT BILLING

1. AISD will be sent statements as per the firm's scheduled billing cycle. Subject to the provisions contained in Paragraph 4, below, all statements received by AISD are due and payable within thirty (30) days from the date of the statement.

2. AISD's statement will be based on the amount of attorney, paralegal, law clerk, or other authorized time spent on AISD's matter multiplied by the hourly rate for the District's matter that is the subject of representation. Time spent will be reported and billed in .10-hour increments.

3. AISD is encouraged to ask any questions about billing at any time, and any questions about statements for services and expenses upon receipt, any estimates of fees or expenses are subject to development of the matter or litigation, which can change with issues that arise or are presented. FIRM does not guarantee the result of any transactional or litigation made the subject of representation.

4. In the event AISD disagrees with or raises a concern regarding fees and/or expenses contained in the FIRM billings, AISD will notify FIRM, of its concern or disagreement within fifteen (15) business days of AISD receiving such billings. The thirty (30) day time frame for payment of billings referenced above will not apply to billings disputed by AISD and that are timely noticed to the FIRM.

#### MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1. FIRM shall perform the services under this Agreement only at the request of the Superintendent or designee(s), or the Board President or designee(s).

2. AISD will establish such policies as are necessary to interface the services rendered hereunder with its staff and personnel and will make its staff and other necessary persons available at reasonable times, and from time to time, in order for FIRM to perform its services.

3. Texas law shall govern this Agreement. In the event any part or provision of this Agreement shall be held to be illegal, such illegal provision shall be deleted, shall not affect any other part of this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such illegal provision had never been contained herein.

4. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in acceptance with the laws of the State of Texas and venue of any action regarding the Agreement shall be in Tarrant County, Texas.

5. AISD and FIRM mutually acknowledge that the Agreement incorporates by reference the terms of the Request for Proposal. The parties further acknowledge the terms contained in this Agreement and Request for Proposal constitute the entire agreement between the parties and supersede any and all written or oral understandings, statements, professes, or inducements contrary to or inconsistent with the terms of the Agreement. To the extent there is a conflict between the Agreement and the Request for Proposal, the Request for Proposal controls.

6. This Agreement may be amended by means of a writing signed by authorized representatives of AISD and FIRM.

#### TERMINATION

1. At anytime during the term of this Agreement or any extension hereof, either party shall have the right to terminate the Agreement by giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice of their desire and intention to terminate the Agreement.

2. Within 30 days of termination of the Agreement and engagement of services, Firm will provide to AISD all files related to matters handled by the Firm, including all pleadings and correspondence, with the exception of firm papers related to those matters. However, all pending or active files at the time of termination will be transferred to the District or new counsel, as identified by the District, within 7 days of the date of termination. Firm papers include firm administrative records, time and expense reports, personnel and staffing materials, and credit and accounting records, and internal lawyers' work product such as drafts, notes, internal memoranda, including investigative reports, prepared by or for the internal use of lawyers. However, Firm agrees to provide to the District, at its request, those attorney notes and memoranda Firm and its attorneys are ethically obligated to provide a client.

### **Purpose:**


To give the Board of Trustees the opportunity to consider an amendment to interlocal agreement between Arlington Independent School District (District) and the City of Arlington (City) for use of the District's Natatorium.

### **Background:**

AISSD and City administrations have negotiated terms of an agreement that includes a provision for the \$1 million payment from the City to the construction project and shared use of the warm-up pool included in the natatorium. The City paid \$1 million in three installments during construction of the natatorium. Additionally, the City will pay a total of \$500,000 for scheduled use of the warm-up pool during periods in which the pool is not needed for AISSD student programs. The City will make annual \$100,000.00 payments to AISSD over the next five years. The City will hold open swim, lessons and other water activities during their use of the pool. Both the use of the facility by the City and the payments by the City were delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The District has received the \$1 million payment from the City and the District has received the first annual \$100,000.00 payment from the City. The resolution provides for a date change in the use of the facility by the City, and the installments paid by the City from the opening of the facility (August 2020) to March 2021.

### **Recommendation:**

Administration recommends approval of the amendment to the interlocal agreement between Arlington Independent School District (District) and the City of Arlington (City) for use of the District's natatorium.



AMENDMENT NO. 1

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT AMENDMENT is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2020, by and between the ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, a school district formed under the laws of the State of Texas (hereinafter "AISD"), acting herein by and through its governing body, and CITY OF ARLINGTON, TEXAS, (hereinafter "CITY") a Municipal Corporation acting herein by and through its governing body, both of Tarrant County, State of Texas.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, AISD and CITY through an interlocal agreement (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") dated December 13, 2018 agreed to certain terms and conditions related to a Natatorium to be built by the AISD and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provided that CITY would contribute funds for the building of the Natatorium in exchange the City would get certain use of the facilities at a specific rate; and

WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 pandemic the parties would like to delay the time in which the City would begin its use of the facilities; and

WHEREAS, AISD and CITY desire to make the amendment to delay the starting date on which the CITY will begin its use of the Natatorium; NOW THEREFORE;

I.

The Agreement is incorporated herein as if written word for word. Except as provided below, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain unchanged and shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the provisions set forth in the modification and the Agreement, this amendment shall govern and control. In consideration of the foregoing, and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

Section III. (C) of the Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:

- C. Upon completion of the project, CITY will be given regular use of the warm-up and competition pools for an initial term period of 10 years from March 1, 2021. The CITY will pay a flat fee of \$100,000 per year for five consecutive years for the maintenance and use of the warm-up and competition pools. The first installment shall be due on March 1, 2021 and the remaining four installments shall each be due on the anniversary date of the first payment. AISD shall issue no refund to CITY for payments CITY has made to AISD except as stated in Section III, Paragraph E of this Agreement. The CITY



will provide lifeguards and necessary equipment for the CITY programs operated at the Natatorium. AISD will provide all equipment to operate and maintain the Natatorium and warm-up pool.

II.

Article IV, TERMINATION of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:

The term of this Agreement shall expire ten years from March 1, 2021. The Agreement can be terminated at any time without liability by the mutual written consent of both parties.

III.

The Agreement is amended by the addition of Article XIV, FORCE MAJEURE to read as follows:

The parties may postpone any obligations of this Agreement if due to acts of God, war, government regulations and mandates, pandemics, disasters, strikes, civil disorders, transportation difficulties which make performance impractical, epidemic or other unplanned or reasonably unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of either party, making it impossible or illegal to provide the facilities or services. The postponement may last for the duration of the force majeure event.

AISD and the CITY recognizes that this Agreement Amendment shall commence on the day first written above and continue in full force and effect until termination in accordance with its provisions.

**Purpose:** To provide the Board of Trustees the opportunity to review and approve the procurement method for the 2019 Bond Program, Phase II Bid Package 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 Projects.

**Background:** Board Policy CV (Local) requires, "the Board shall determine the project delivery/contract award method to be used for each construction contract valued at or above \$50,000. To assist the Board, the Superintendent shall recommend the project delivery/contract award method that he determines provides the best value to the District."

Administration recommends selection of Construction Manager-at-Risk (CMAR) as the procurement method for the 2019 Bond Program, Phase II, Bid Package 1 project. Furthermore, administration recommends selection of Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) as the procurement method for the 2019 Bond Program, Phase II, Bid Package 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 projects. Included herewith is a memorandum briefly describing the two most commonly used construction procurement methods and a recommendation explaining which of the two methods were selected for each projects and why it is considered the procurement method that will provide the best value for the individual project.

**Recommendation:** Administration recommends approval of CMAR as the procurement method for the 2019 Bond Program, Phase II, Bid Package 1 project and CSP as the procurement method for the 2019 Bond Program, Phase II, Bid Package 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 projects.

**SUBJECT:** Selection of Method of Procurement (MOP) for 2019 Bond Program, Phase II Bid Packages 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7

State law sets forth eight procurement methods that governmental entities, including school districts, can use to procure construction services. As summarized in Board Policy CV (LEGAL), the law requires all district construction contracts valued at \$50,000 or more in the aggregate for each 12 month period to be made by the method that provides the best value to the district, and the Board must declare the procurement method to be used for each project. The two methods used most commonly statewide are Competitive Sealed Proposal and Construction Manager-at-Risk. Following is a brief description of these procurement methods and recommendation for one of these two procurement methods to be utilized for each of the Phase II, Bid Package 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 construction projects in the 2019 Bond Program.

### **Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP)**

*CSP is a delivery method similar to competitive bidding in that the District selects an Architect/Engineer to design the project. Once the construction documents are fully completed, the District solicits proposals from contractors to perform the work. Selection is generally based on a combination of price and other factors that the District deems in its best interest, such as project team personnel, schedule, contractors past experience, etc.*

### **Construction Management-at-Risk (CMAR)**

*CMAR is a delivery method wherein the Construction Manager-at-Risk serves as the General Contractor assuming the risk for a construction guaranteed maximum price and provides design phase consultation in evaluating costs, schedule, implications of alternative designs and systems and materials during and after design of the facility.*

### **Procurement Method Recommendation for 2019 Bond Program, Phase II Bid, Package 1 Project 1:**

Listed below is the 2019 Bond Program, Phase II, Bid Package 1, Project 1 and the recommended construction procurement method for the project:

### Construction Manager-at-Risk (CMAR) Recommendation

This project is more complex and involves a larger project scope where project phasing and scheduling is critical for overall project success. The CMAR procurement method allows the general contractor to participate more in the project planning, design, and estimating phases. Greater project value can be achieved through this means of project procurement.

### Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) Recommendation

These projects are primarily deficiency and life cycle replacement work with a relatively small project scope. Project phasing and scheduling are simplified and defined. District administration and the project architects have determined that the current construction market is more favorable for CSP project delivery with potentially greater project value achieved as a result of more aggressive and competitive pricing.

**Subject:** Local Teaching Permit for Thomas Lyons, Building Maintenance Technology

**Purpose:**

Since 1995, Texas law has allowed school districts to issue a school district teaching permit to someone who does not hold a teaching certificate subject to approval by the commissioner of education (Texas Education Code §21.055). For "noncore academic career and technical education (CTE) courses" only, state law allows the school district board of trustees to issue a school district teaching permit without approval by the commissioner of education (House Bill 2205, 84th Regular Legislative Session). Effective September 1, 2015.

The Administration recommends the Board approve the issuance of a local teaching permit to the individual named above.

**Subject:** STAAR Results Update

### **Purpose:**

To provide the Board of Trustees with an overview of Arlington ISD's State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) results for the 2020-2021 school year.

### **Background:**

In the Spring 2021, students in grades 3-8 participated in the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness commonly called STAAR. Although the state assessments will not be used for state or federal accountability purposes for the 2020–2021 school year, they are intended to provide districts with equitable baseline data necessary to determine actual learning loss experienced by students during the COVID-19 crisis. This presentation will provide the Board with an overview of the assessment results for the 2021 spring administration and its impact on accelerated learning plans for the 2021-2022 school year.
