PURPOSE: To consider adoption of an ordinance setting the 2021 ad valorem tax rate

BACKGROUND: Arlington ISD's fiscal year begins July 1. State law requires that the annual budget be adopted before the fiscal year begins. The ad valorem tax rate to fund the budget is set after the budget is adopted and is based on certified property values determined by Tarrant Appraisal District ("TAD") and released by July 25th of each year.

The fiscal year 2021-22 budget was adopted by the Board of Trustees on June 22, 2021. Tarrant Appraisal District provided the certified property values dated July 21, 2021. The property tax rate of \$1.3608 per \$100 of taxable value is proposed to fund the 2021-22 general operating and debt service fund budgets:

ORDINANCE NO. 141

AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE TAX LEVY FOR THE YEAR 2021 ON ALL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION SITUATED WITHIN THE ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

THAT for the year 2021 there is hereby levied on all property located within the corporate limits of the ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT on the first day of January 2021 and not exempt from taxation by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, an ad valorem tax of \$1.3608 on each and every \$100 valuation of such property apportioned as follows:

- (A) \$1.0601 on each and every \$100 valuation of such property is hereby levied and assessed to pay for the operation and maintenance of public free schools of the said ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- (B) \$0.3007 on each and every \$100 valuation of such property is hereby levied and assessed to pay current interest and provide a fixed fund for payment of bonds issued by the said ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

<u>Purpose</u>: To give the Board of Trustees the opportunity to consider and act on Change Order #2 amending the contract amount and final completion date for the 2019 Bond Construction Project for the Enterprise Centre Project, Phase I – Bid Package 4.

Background: As a part of the renovation, deficiency and life cycle improvements at the Enterprise Centre, the General Contractor, Key Construction of Texas (Key) has incurred certain unforeseen conditions and been requested to make minor modifications to the 2nd and 3rd floors that cannot be funded through the original, Board approved, construction contract. These changes include site changes to address requests by the City of Arlington and the accessibility specialist to complete the project and receive a certificate of occupancy. Additionally, there are minor modifications to mechanical, electrical, technology, and structure to accommodate recent staffing changes. Finally, an extension of the roof lightning protection system is being added to protect new mechanical equipment. Key has submitted Change Order #2 for the Enterprise Centre project for \$191,228.16. This change order is comprised of four main items summarized in the table below.

In addition to the cost impact of addressing these changes, there is a need to allow Key additional time to complete this work. The CSP agreement, approved by the Board of Trustees on May 20, 2020, provided for a substantial completion date of May 31, 2021, and a final completion date of July 30, 2021. Key achieved substantial completion, as required. It is necessary to extend the final completion date for the project by an additional 60 days. Key has submitted Change Order #2 to amend the contract amount and the final completion date.

Corgan, the project architect, has reviewed the change order and validated the costs with Key and AISD staff. Change Order Summary:

As the Arlington ISD Enterprise Centre project draws to a close, there are a few items that represent unforeseen conditions that must be completed to address changes requested by the City of Arlington and the TAS (Texas Accessibility Specialist) reviewer to receive the certificate of occupancy and final completion. Additionally, there are minor modifications being made to the 2nd and 3rd Floors to accommodate recent changes to staffing. These changes cannot be supported with the remaining Project Contingency funds and require the approval of Change Order #2.

We have thoroughly reviewed the contingency log with the contractor including all pending and forthcoming items and recommend the following be addressed:

Item 1: Site Improvements including fence, bollard installation, and minor paving repairs around the Emergency Generator and Transformer yard. Additionally, installation of a new guard rail at the sidewalk and the drainage flume for pedestrian protection and additional sod for the disturbed areas around the site.

Key Construction is requesting \$34,920.00 for this scope of work.

Item 2: Interior renovations including additional offices on Floors 2 and 3 with the associated MEP, technology, and structural work necessary to create and support the modified spaces. Additionally, minor wall modifications and patching at elevator lobbies due to elevator replacement by the District's contractor and seating arms of Board area seating will be addressed.

Key Construction is requesting \$71,211.08 for this scope of work.

Item 3: Extension of existing lighting protection on roof to protect the new mechanical equipment.

Key Construction is requesting \$12,287.70 for this scope of work.

Item 4: Contractor's General Conditions, Bonds, Insurance, Overhead and Profit associated with change in scope and construction costs for the project.

Key Construction is requesting \$72,809.38 for this scope of work.

Due to these unforeseen conditions, we recommend for consideration and approval Change Order #2 for \$191,228.16 to address the conditions identified and add 60 days to extend the final completion date of the contract to September 28, 2021.

This letter is to inform you of certain unforeseen conditions related to the Arlington ISD Enterprise Centre project that cannot be supported with the remaining Project Contingency funds.

After a thorough review of the pending and potential changes remaining on the contingency log with the architect, we recommend the following.

Item 1: Site improvements including replacement and extension of existing fencing surrounding the Emergency Generator and Transformer yard. The existing wood fence is in poor condition and requires extension to encompass the new generator location. The scope includes three bollards to protect the new generator and minor paving repairs. Additional site improvements included are installing a new guard rail at the sidewalk and the drainage flume for pedestrian protection and additional sod around the site.

Cost proposed to furnish the scope above: \$34,920.00

Item 2: Interior renovations including additional offices on Floors 2 and 3. This scope of work includes modifications pertaining to ceilings, fire alarm, fire sprinkler, HVAC, electrical, data connections, as well as removing and relocating markerboards, patching and painting walls, and additional room signage, light fixtures, controls, window film and art rail. Also included in scope is wall patching at elevator lobbies due to replacement by others and additional arms for the board room seating.

Cost proposed to furnish the scope above: \$71,211.08

Item 3: Extension of existing lightning protection on roof

Cost proposed to furnish the scope above: \$12,287.70

Subject: 2019 Bond Program Update

Purpose:

To update the Board on progress of the 2019 Bond Program

Background:

Work on the 2019 Bond Program has begun.

Voters approved a bond proposition for \$966 million on November 5, 2019. The 2019 Bond Program is a five-year capital program that includes new construction, renovations and facility condition improvements along with capital purchases for technology, fine arts and transportation.

A total of \$505,518,172 in bonds have been authorized and sold as of February 2021, for the 2019 Bond Program. The Phase I issuance was \$311,104,011 and the Phase II issuance was \$194,414,161. Work has begun on Phase I projects with nine projects currently under construction, two projects currently in the process of bidding, and one in the architectural design stage. Design professionals were approved for Phase II projects on December 10, 2020, with all thirteen projects in the planning and design stage. Design professionals were approved for Phase II projects in the contract development process. Design work for Phase III projects will begin in September of 2021. Procurement of vehicles, instruments, uniforms, and technology for year 2 of the bond program is underway.

Administration will provide an update on the 2019 bond program.
