<u>Purpose</u>: To consider the Schematic Design for the 2019 Bond Program, Phase III, Bid Package 1, Project I, Carter Junior High School replacement school project

Background: A replacement school for Carter Junior High School was approved as part of the 2019 Bond Program. The east Arlington community will realize a fresh, new school facility that incorporates state of the art school design, larger and more functional classroom spaces that meet the needs of all students, and more efficient site circulation for student arrival and departure. Corgan Architects was approved to provide architectural services for the project. Corgan developed the schematic design for the junior high school using the District's established educational program and a series of four virtual design charrette meetings held with central administration, campus administration and staff, students, parents, and the District's Facilities Planning and Construction team.

Corgan Architects will present the Schematic Design for Board review and approval. With this approval, the Carter Junior High School replacement school project is on schedule for substantial completion in fall 2025.

<u>Recommendation</u>: The Administration recommends approval of the Schematic Design for Carter Junior High School as presented by Corgan Architects.

Purpose:

The purpose is for the Board to approve the District's SHAC recommendation of curriculum materials for human sexuality instruction.

Background:

The State Board of Education issued Proclamation 2022, which called for health and physical education instructional materials, which include curriculum materials for human sexuality instruction. The adoption of these materials go into classrooms during the 2022-2023 school year. Further, HB 1525 requires that the Board ensure that the District's human sexuality instructional materials meet the following requirements:

- 1) Based on advice from the School Health Advisory Council (SHAC)
- 2) Be suitable for subject and grade level for which the instruction is intended
- 3) Reviewed by academic experts in the subject and grade level
- 4) Must cover the TEKS

According to Board policy EHAA Legal, the board shall adopt a policy establishing a process for the adoption of curriculum materials for the district's human sexuality instruction. The policy must require:

- 1) The board to adopt a resolution convening the local SHAC for the purpose of making recommendations regarding the curriculum materials;
- 2) The local SHAC to:
 - a) After the board's adoption of the resolution, hold at least two public meetings on the curriculum materials before adopting recommendations; and
 - b) Provide the adopted recommendations to the board at a public meeting of the board; and
- 3) The board, after receipt of the local SHAC's recommendations under item 2, above, to take action on the adoption of the recommendations by a record vote at a public meeting [see BDF]. The SHAC held two meetings for public input on March 28 and March 30, 2022.

Before adopting curriculum materials for the district's human sexuality instruction, the board shall ensure that the curriculum materials are:

- 1) Based on the advice of the local SHAC;
- 2) Suitable for the subject and grade level for which the curriculum materials are intended; and
- 3) Reviewed by academic experts in the subject and grade level for which the curriculum materials are intended.

SUBJECT: RFP 22-34 ESSER and Title IV Funds Library Print Books

In RFP 22-34, Arlington ISD asked for proposals to procure print books using ESSER and Title IV Funds. The books purchased are being used to meet the following objectives:

- to close the gap from COVID-19 loss of learning
- to make popular reads more accessible to our mobile populations.

Notice of the request for proposal was advertised in accordance with state law.

Proposals were received from thirteen vendors:

ABDO Publishing Co Bellweather Media Bound to Stay Bound Books Capstone Children's Plus, Inc Crabtree Publishing Company Educational Development Corp Follett Content Solutions, LLLC Gumdrop Books J Appleseed, Inc Rourke Educational Media Sebco Books World Book

Proposals received from the vendors were evaluated based on criteria published in the RFP document:

- Price 40 points
- Quality of vendor's goods and services 30 points
- Extent to which the goods or services meets the district's needs 10 points
- Any other relevant factors specifically listed in the RFP 10 points
- The vendor's past relationship with the District and other Districts of like size and references 10 points

An evaluation committee consisting of the Coordinator of Library Media Services, Library Media Services Specialist, Library Media Services Clerk, and one campus librarian evaluated each proposal. The committee recommends the following:

Children's Plus be awarded the following for elementary campus libraries to purchase:

- a. Children's fiction(appropriate for grade PreK-6)- trade hardback binding
- b. Children's fiction (appropriate for grade PreK-6)- library binding or rebind
- c. Children's non-fiction (appropriate for grade PreK-6)-- trade hardback binding
- d. Children's non-fiction (appropriate for grade PreK-6)-- library binding or rebind

Follett be awarded the following for junior high and high school campus libraries to purchase:

MARKET RECAP - FEBRUARY 2022:

February was a wildly uneven month with a number of key economic variables improving while inflationary pressure moved higher. Normally, the combination is a recipe for higher bond yields and expectations that the Fed would be more aggressive in its rate hikes. Indeed, yields moved higher for much of the month (once again), although the Russian invasion of Ukraine prompted a late flight-to-quality and introduces *the biggest wildcard we've seen in generations*.

The most unexpected data release during the month was the January employment report. It wasn't so much the strong +467k rise in nonfarm payrolls for the month of January as it was a broad smoothing of the monthly numbers for all of 2021 thanks to the annual benchmark revisions. Once the reshuffling was complete, the labor market suddenly appeared to be on solid ground. This led Fed officials to admit their full employment mandate had been met, leaving the stable inflation mandate as their primary focus. Unfortunately, inflation has not yet peaked. The January CPI report showed headline consumer inflation at +7.5% year-over-year, *yet another four-decade high*, while core CPI (ex food and energy) climbed to +6.0% on an annual basis. This prompted St. Louis Fed President James Bullard to announce he expected 100 basis points of rate increases before July 1st. Bullard is a voting member, but he's only one of 12. Most committee members, including Chairman Jay Powell, remain in favor of a more gradual approach ...for now anyway. Fed members have made it clear that future policy decisions will be data dependent.

There were quite a few other eye-opening economic releases during the month, but two non-economic events rendered the data less relevant by comparison. The first is a sharp downturn in new COVID cases. In fact, cases had fallen by nearly 95% since the mid-January peak, and at this point there are no variants of significance in line to replace Omicron. The reduced virus threat opened the door for continued progress to be made in the service sector. It also suggested that the disconnect between job-openings and job seekers will narrow as more Americans are able to return to work.

If Russia had not attacked Ukraine, the overall outlook would probably be much brighter. However, the war has greatly ramped-up uncertainty, and is widely expected to increase inflation while putting the brakes on economic growth. Fed officials will be walking a fine line as they raise rates to contain inflation and slow domestic demand ...because signs of weakness are already emerging. The number of rate hikes expected over the next 12 months has slipped from seven to six. Whispers of a possible recession in Europe suggest even six hikes may be too much. The war is fueling an outlook that's considerably less bright. Expect continued market volatility as uncertainty reins.







WHEREAS, Texas Education Code (TEC) Section 25.081 authorizes the Commissioner of Education to approve requests for a variance in total instructional minutes if the District is closed for disasters, floods, or extreme weather conditions or other emergencies that force the closing of schools; and

WHEREAS, TEC Section 42.005 authorizes the Commissioner of Education to adjust the average daily attendance of a district if the district is closed for disasters, floods, extreme weather conditions or other emergencies that have a significant effect on the district's attendance; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Education has stated that TEC Section 21.401(c) represents a legislative determination that a public purpose exists to continue educators' salaries during times of emergencies; and

WHEREAS, all district employees—contractual and at-will—contribute to the achievement of the educational mission of Arlington ISD;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES THAT:

1. Payment is authorized for all regular employees, excluding short term substitutes, temporary employees, and contractors in all campus facilities, support facilities and administrative offices on February 24, 2022, and the morning of February 25, 2022, who were unable to participate in scheduled work due to severe weather district closure and delayed start time.

2. The Board of Trustees hereby (1) determines that these payments serve a public purpose, (2) retains sufficient control over the expenditures to ensure a public purpose is served, and (3) is confident the District will receive a return benefit.

Voting For: <u>7</u> Voting Against: <u>0</u>

President Mays reported that the motion passed.

Regarding Item J-Approval of Change Order #1 Amending the Contract Amount for the 2019 Bond Construction Project for the Thornton Elementary School Replacement Project, Phase I – Bid Package 7, Mr. Chapa asked Mr. Horn questions related to the underwater retention, the basis and timing for the review and design plans, and the City of Arlington's request for a third party review of water retention capacity. Mr. Chapa expressed his displeasure with the frequency with which these changes occur, after AISD has completed due diligence study and seems, to some extent, subsidizes infrastructure that should not be the responsibility of the AISD.

Motion by David Wilbanks, second by Melody Fowler, to approve consent agenda Item J.

Dr. Reich reported that he was ready to move forward with the vote, but agreed with Mr. Chapa in concern that there is not a formal opportunity or process for the AISD to appeal decisions. These budget changes take money away from students and that is wrong.

Voting For: <u>6</u> Voting Against: <u>1</u> Justin Chapa voting against.

President Mays reported that the motion passed.

DISCUSSION:

B. House Bill 3 and District Improvement Plan Progress Monitoring Update

Chief Academic Officer Dr. Steven Wurtz and Assistant Superintendent of Elementary Schools Dr. Christi Buell provided an update on progress pertaining to student outcomes on the middle-of-year reading and mathematics screeners for prekindergarten students.

Dr. Wurtz presented the student data and charts reflecting the beginning-of-year benchmark and middle-of-year results for students in the prekindergarten-four program. The goals percentages were created based on scale score cut points for the end-of-year prekindergarten benchmark and reflected marked improvements. Dr. Buell reported that teacher collaboration and support with lesson design, planning and implementation of small group instruction, implementation of differentiation and use of aligned instructional resources contributed to gains. Challenges to instructional improvement include delayed student enrollment, student attendance, the social-emotional needs of students and COVID-19 related factors.

OPEN FORUM FOR NON-AGENDA ITEMS: None

SUPERINTEDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent Cavazos thanked everyone who had a hand in the United States Army Field Band and Soldiers' Chorus performance at AISD's Center for Visual and Performing Arts. Their "America the Beautiful" show was an outstanding showcase of their talents. Special thanks to the team at the CVPA for helping make this event, which was free for the public, happen.

He congratulated Foster Elementary students and staff for their success in the recent *Souper Bowl of Caring* food drive. In the two weeks leading up to the Super Bowl, the school collected more than 1,400 food items that were donated to Mission Arlington. To add a little competitive spirit to the food drive, the school was split into four houses, with the smallest house collecting the most items.

Dr. Cavazos thanked everyone who had a hand in the annual College and Career Expo at the Dan Dipert Career and Technical Center. This was the first time since 2019 that the event was done inperson. More than seventy colleges, universities and businesses were on hand to talk to AISD students about their futures. This event also included workshops for college prep and was open to junior high students. He also thanked inspireED for helping make the event run so smoothly.

Sam Houston High School wrapped up its annual Black History Month program with special guest Arlington Police Chief Al Jones visiting with students in the auditorium after school. It was an excellent setting for the students as Chief Jones let them ask questions about anything they wanted to know. The open forum created some interesting dialogue and then Chief Jones ended the event by hugging each student. He also talked about a student advisory committee he wants to establish.

Chief Jones also joined several members of AISD staff, police officers, Arlington Mayor Jim Ross and AISD Trustee Justin Chapa at Crouch Elementary for the school's annual Reading Rocks event. Like every other guest, Chief Jones grabbed a book from the library then went and read to classes throughout the school. The guests also took questions from students about what they do in their daily lives. Dr. Cavazos thanked everyone for taking time to go visit Crouch Elementary.

Superintendent Cavazos extended a special thank you to AISD's educational diagnosticians and school social workers. This is the annual week they are honored and he wanted to thank them personally for everything they do to help some of the students who need it most.

SCHOOL BOARD'S REPORT:

Mrs. Fowler reported that she and Mrs. McMurrough loved seeing all of the students, specifically the junior high students, at the recent college and career expo. The students attending with their mom or dad were already thinking about college or career choices. She participated at the Arlington Baptist University table and was very impressed as the students came asking questions about their futures.

Mr. Wilbanks thanked everyone for their support through a tough week. He shared his appreciation for his colleagues on the Board and asked for continued prayer for his nephew, losing his only parent, and for his sister's husband. COVID has been tough on a lot of people, teachers, students and taken a toll on quite a few industries. Systemic cracks in society and in particular the healthcare system are not good right now; it is time to look at the last two years and move forward with improvement. This is the best country in the world and should have the best healthcare.

Mrs. Mays asked everyone to take the information learned and try to do better and make change. Also, Mrs. Mays reported that March was women's history month and that women rise by lifting up others. As the current female president of the AISD Board, she thanked those prior to her including Diane Patrick, Sherri Wade, Gloria Peña and Jamie Sullins. From Maya Angelou, "You may not control all the events that happen to you, but you can decide not to be reduced by them."

Secretary Fowler had no items to report.

President Mays adjourned the meeting at 9:55 p.m. The Board did not return to closed session.

RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Arlington Independent School District that the Superintendent is authorized to negotiate and execute all necessary legal documents to grant a non-exclusive drainage easement to the City of Arlington in accordance with the provisions set out herein; and be it further

RESOLVED that the duration of the easement may be perpetual but, AISD reserves a reverter if the property is not used for the aforementioned public purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED that the easement is limited to the operation and maintenance of drainage facilities and regular use thereof.

THAT in this instrument the following definitions shall apply:

GRANTOR OR DISTRICT: The Arlington Independent School District, a local unit of government, duly organized and operating under the laws of the State of Texas.

GRANTEE OR CITY: City of Arlington, a municipal corporation of Tarrant County, Texas.

CONSIDERATION: The dedication, conveyance, and covenants herein are made in consideration of the benefits accruing to Grantor as the owner of certain adjacent property by reason of the Facilities, conditions, covenants and agreements herein set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged.

PROPERTY: A portion of Lot 2, A.C. Wingate Addition, an addition to the City of Arlington, according to the plat recorded in Cabinet A, Slide 587, Plat Records, Tarrant County, Texas, and being a portion of a called 10.3 acres tract of las as described in the deed to Arlington Independent School District recorded in Volume 2891, Page 138 of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas, and more specifically described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes as if copied here verbatim;

EASEMENT: A public drainage easement in, under, over, through, across, and along the Property;

BENEFITTED PROPERTY: Lot 2, A.C. Wingate Addition, an addition to the City of Arlington, according to the plat recorded in Cabinet A, Slide 587, Plat Records, Tarrant County, Texas, and being a portion of a called 10.3 acres tract of las as described in the deed to Arlington Independent School District recorded in Volume 2891, Page 138 of the Deed Records of Tarrant County, Texas, and any and all lots created therefrom abutting, adjacent, or served by the Facilities as hereafter defined.

BENEFICIARY: Owner of the Benefitted Property and the heir, successor, or assignee of Grantor;

PUBLIC USE: To lay, construct, reconstruct, inspect, repair, maintain, protect, replace, make connections to, and use storm drains together with all necessary appurtenances thereto including manholes, signs, inlets, headwalls, outfall structures, and catchment basins, and other improvements reasonably necessary for operation of the storm drains (collectively, the "Facilities"), including the right to build the Facilities on such grade and according to such plans and specifications as will, in the City's opinion, best serve the public purpose; and

THAT, Grantor, owner of the Benefitted Property, for the consideration described herein, does hereby convey, set apart and reserve to Grantee the Easement for the Public Use upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The full obligation and responsibility of construction, maintenance, and operation of the Facilities shall be borne by Grantor and shall be deemed to be covenants and deed restrictions upon the Benefitted Property and binding upon every Beneficiary and successor in interest to Grantor. The covenants and deed restrictions shall include the full joint and several obligation and responsibility of Grantor and each and every Beneficiary to maintain and operate said Facilities. Grantor shall require every such successor in interest to accept full joint and several obligation, responsibility, and liability for the performance of the obligations stated herein and shall include an express acceptance by each such successor in any deed conveying all or part of the Benefitted Property

2. Grantee shall record this Public Drainage Easement, Restrictive Covenants, and Maintenance Agreement in the Official Public Records of Tarrant County, Texas, and thereafter Grantor shall specifically reference such recording numbers and information upon any Plat hereafter filed for the Benefitted Property.

3. Grantee shall have the right to forbid, prevent, remove, and keep removed from the Easement any and all structures, fences, trees, shrubs, excavations, impoundments of water, grade or elevation changes, and any other obstructions or encroachments which may, in the sole judgment of the Grantee, endanger or interfere with the Public Use of the Easement; together with the right and privilege at any and all times to enter said Easement tract or parcel of land, or any part thereof, for the purpose of exercising the said rights and with the right and privilege to perform all acts necessary to the Public Use of said Easement.

4. The Easement and the terms hereof shall be a covenant running with the Benefitted Property and shall be binding upon Grantor, Beneficiary, and the heirs, successors, and assigns of each. In the event that the dominant and servient estates are, or ever become, owned by the same person or entity, this conveyance and reservation shall be construed as a deed restriction, and the Doctrine of Merger shall not apply. Any application of the Doctrine of Merger is expressly waived by Grantor.

5. The City will never be responsible for the design, development, construction, operation or maintenance or use of the the Facilities, which shall be created, financed, designed, constructed, operated, and maintained by Grantor and Beneficiary. However, the plans and surveys for the Facilities shall be submitted to the City for review and approval in advance of any construction. Nothing herein shall relieve Grantor from the obligation to comply with all City ordinances and codes in effect now or in the future. The Facilities **SHALL NOT** be connected to any City-owned or operated facility or system without the **EXPRESS WRITTEN PERMISSION OF THE CITY**.

6. The City shall have the right to to enter the Easement, or any part thereof, at any time to inspect the Facilities and take any action it deems necessary, in its sole discretion, to protect the Public Use, any City-owned facility or system, and for the proper use of any rights granted to the City herein.

7. The City shall have access to the Easement for any purpose related to the exercise of governmental services or functions, including but not limited to, fire and police protection, inspection and code enforcement.

8. The Easement may only be altered, dissolved, or abandoned by a subsequent written instrument signed by Grantor, or the heirs, successors, and assignees thereof, and approved in writing by the City. Such instrument shall not be effective until it is filed in the county real property records.

9. The use, occupancy, and enjoyment of the fee simple title not necessary for or interfering with the Easement shall remain in Grantor. Such use, occupancy, and enjoyment may include, but is not limited to, ingress and egress across the Easement, landscaping (not to include trees), parking areas, and driveways. All improvements for the foregoing uses shall be constructed according to appropriate plans reviewed and approved by the City prior to the start of construction.

10. This easement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Texas, specifically Local Government Code $272.001(\ell)$.

INDEMNITY. TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED BY LAW, GRANTOR, BENEFICIARY, AND THE HEIRS, SUCCESSORS, AND ASSIGNEES OF EACH, SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CITY OF ARLINGTON, ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, AND AGENTS FROM ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT LOSS, DAMAGE, LIABILITY OR EXPENSE AND ATTORNEYS' FEES FOR ANY CLAIMS OR LIABILITIES ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS EASEMENT, INCLUDING THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION, MAINTENANCE, CONDITION OR USE OF ANY FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS THEREON.

MAINTENANCE OBLIGATIONS. Grantor and Beneficiary shall operate and maintain the Facilities to a good, functioning, and safe condition in compliance with all applicable laws and in accordance with the requirements of the City as determined by the City in its reasonable discretion including, but not limited to, the following duties:

- a. Frequent mowing in accordance with the Fire Prevention and Nuisance Chapters of the Arlington City Code, as amended, and routine maintenance of the Facilities and Easement.
- b. Periodic removal of debris from the Facilities and Easement.
- c. Maintenance of the Facilities and Easement to the approved designed slope, grade, contour, and volume, including any concrete structures.
- d. Repair areas of erosion. Soil materials used in repairs will be of consistent and compatible characteristics with the surrounding materials and shall be compacted to a density equaling that of the undisturbed surrounding material.
- e. Obtain advance written permission of the Director of Public Works and Transportation of the City of Arlington BEFORE placing any improvements within the Easement.
- f. Upon request from the City, provide to the of the City of Arlington an annual written report, on or before January 31, specifically describing the operation and maintenance of the improvements for the preceding year. Said report shall include a description of procedures used, the names of persons responsible for each procedure, and the date of each procedure.
- g. Correct any condition of the improvements, or any maintenance deficiencies regarding the improvements, that the City reasonably believes to be necessary for the protection of the public health and safety. Such correction shall occur (or if impossible of completion within such time, shall begin) within thirty (30) days from the date the City gives written notice of the condition or deficiency to Grantor or its successors and assigns.

GRANTOR AND BENEFICIARY SHALL BE JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY LIABLE TO THE CITY FOR THE MAINTENANCE OBLIGATIONS, and in the event the Grantor does not perform the Maintenance Obligations, agrees: (a) that the City at its option may perform the Maintenance Obligations, and (b) to the extent allowed by law, to indemnify and hold harmless the City for all City costs necessary to perform the Maintenance Obligations,

THIS AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.

THE PROVISIONS of this EASEMENT, RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS, AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT shall be deemed to be independent and severable, and the invalidity or partial invalidity of any provision or portion hereof does not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision.

GRANTOR DOES HEREBY COVENANT AND AGREE to WARRANT AND FOREVER DEFEND title to the Easement herein granted unto the City against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof subject to the matters set forth herein.

WHEREAS, the City of Arlington wishes to construct a permanent drainage system across the property of 1800 Joyce St., Arlington, and Local Government Code 272.001(ℓ) states that the District may donate this property for a public use that serves the school district if the land benefits the public interest of the donating political subdivision; the donation is made under terms that effect and maintain the public purpose for which the donation or sale is made; and the title and right to possession of the land or interest revert to the donating or selling political subdivision if the acquiring political subdivision ceases to use the land or interest in carrying out the public purpose; **be it therefore**

RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Arlington Independent School District that the Superintendent is authorized to negotiate and execute all necessary legal documents to grant a non-exclusive drainage easement to the City of Arlington in accordance with the provisions set out herein; and be it further

RESOLVED that the duration of the easement may be perpetual but, AISD reserves a reverter if the property is not used for the aforementioned public purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED that the easement is limited to the operation and maintenance of drainage facilities and regular use thereof.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

THAT in this instrument the following definitions shall apply:

GRANTOR: ARLINGTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, a local unit of government, duly organized and operating under the laws of the State of Texas.

GRANTEE OR CITY: City of Arlington, a municipal corporation of Tarrant County, Texas.

CONSIDERATION: The dedication, conveyance, and covenants herein are made in consideration of the benefits accruing to Grantor as the owner of certain adjacent property by reason of the Facilities, conditions, covenants and agreements herein set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged.

PROPERTY: A portion of Lot 4, Block 9, L. Finger Survey Addition, an addition to the City of Arlington, according to the plat recorded in Cabinet A, Slide 1076, Plat Records, Tarrant County, Texas and more specifically described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes as if copied here verbatim;

EASEMENT: A permanent drainage easement in, under, over, through, across, and along the Property;

BENEFITTED PROPERTY: Lot 4, Block 9, L. Finger Survey Addition, an addition to the City of Arlington, according to the plat recorded in Cabinet A, Slide 1076, Plat Records, Tarrant County, Texas and any and all lots created therefrom abutting, adjacent, or served by the Facilities as hereafter defined.

BENEFICIARY: Owner of the Benefitted Property, being Grantor and its heirs, successors, or assigns;

PUBLIC USE: To lay, construct, reconstruct, inspect, repair, maintain, protect, replace, make connections to, and use storm drains together with all necessary appurtenances thereto including manholes, signs, inlets, headwalls, outfall structures, catchment basins, and other improvements reasonably necessary for operation of the storm drains (collectively, the

"Facilities"), including the right to build the Facilities on such grade and according to such plans and specifications as will, in the City's opinion, best serve the public purpose; and

THAT, Grantor, owner of the Benefitted Property, for the consideration described herein, does hereby convey, set apart and reserve to Grantee the Easement for the Public Use upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The full obligation and responsibility of construction, maintenance, and operation of the Facilities shall be borne by Grantor and shall be deemed to be covenants and deed restrictions upon the Benefitted Property and binding upon every Beneficiary and successor in interest to Grantor. The covenants and deed restrictions shall include the full joint and several obligation and responsibility of Grantor and each and every Beneficiary to maintain and operate said Facilities. Grantor shall require every such successor in interest to accept full joint and several obligation, responsibility, and liability for the performance of the obligations stated herein and shall include an express acceptance by each such successor in any deed conveying all or part of the Benefitted Property

2. Grantee shall record this Public Drainage Easement, Restrictive Covenants, and Maintenance Agreement in the Official Public Records of Tarrant County, Texas, and thereafter Grantor shall specifically reference such recording numbers and information upon any Plat hereafter filed for the Benefitted Property.

3. Grantee shall have the right to forbid, prevent, remove, and keep removed from the Easement any and all structures, fences, trees, shrubs, excavations, impoundments of water, grade or elevation changes, and any other obstructions or encroachments which may, in the sole judgment of the Grantee, endanger or interfere with the Public Use of the Easement; together with the right and privilege at any and all times to enter said Easement tract or parcel of land, or any part thereof, for the purpose of exercising the said rights and with the right and privilege to perform all acts necessary to the Public Use of said Easement.

4. The Easement and the terms hereof shall be a covenant running with the Benefitted Property and shall be binding upon Grantor, Beneficiary, and the heirs, successors, and assigns of each. In the event that the dominant and servient estates are, or ever become, owned by the same person or entity, this conveyance and reservation shall be construed as a deed restriction, and the Doctrine of Merger shall not apply. Any application of the Doctrine of Merger is expressly waived by Grantor.

5. The City will never be responsible for the design, development, construction, operation or maintenance or use of the the Facilities, which shall be privately created, financed, designed, constructed, operated, and maintained by Grantor and Beneficiary. However, the plans and surveys for the Facilities shall be submitted to the City for review and approval in advance of any construction. Nothing herein shall relieve Grantor from the obligation to comply with all City ordinances and codes in effect now or in the future. The Facilities SHALL NOT be connected to any City-owned or operated facility or system without the EXPRESS WRITTEN PERMISSION OF THE CITY.

6. The City shall have the right to to enter the Easement, or any part thereof, at any time to inspect the Facilities and take any action it deems necessary, in its sole discretion, to protect the Public Use, any City-owned facility or system, and for the proper use of any rights granted to the City herein.

7. The City shall have access to the Easement for any purpose related to the exercise of governmental services or functions, including but not limited to, fire and police protection, inspection and code enforcement.

8. This easement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Texas, specifically Local Government Code 272.001(ℓ).

9. The Easement may only be altered, dissolved, or abandoned by a subsequent written instrument signed by Grantor, or the heirs, successors, and assignees thereof, and approved in writing by the City. Such instrument shall not be effective until it is filed in the county real property records.

10. The use, occupancy, and enjoyment of the fee simple title not necessary for or interfering with the Easement shall remain in Grantor. Such use, occupancy, and enjoyment may include, but is not limited to, ingress and egress across the Easement, landscaping (not to include trees), parking areas, and driveways. All improvements for the foregoing uses shall be constructed according to appropriate plans reviewed and approved by the City prior to the start of construction.

INDEMNITY. TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED BY LAW GRANTOR, BENEFICIARY, AND THE HEIRS, SUCCESSORS, AND ASSIGNEES OF EACH, SHALL INDEMNIFY, DEFEND AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CITY OF ARLINGTON, ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, AND AGENTS FROM ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT LOSS, DAMAGE, LIABILITY OR EXPENSE AND ATTORNEYS' FEES FOR ANY CLAIMS OR LIABILITIES ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS EASEMENT, INCLUDING THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION, MAINTENANCE, CONDITION OR USE OF ANY FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS THEREON.

MAINTENANCE OBLIGATIONS. Grantor and Beneficiary shall operate and maintain the Facilities to a good, functioning, and safe condition in compliance with all applicable laws and in accordance with the requirements of the City as determined by the City in its reasonable discretion including, but not limited to, the following duties:

- a. Frequent mowing in accordance with the Fire Prevention and Nuisance Chapters of the Arlington City Code, as amended, and routine maintenance of the Facilities and Easement.
- b. Periodic removal of debris from the Facilities and Easement.
- c. Maintenance of the Facilities and Easement to the approved designed slope, grade, contour, and volume, including any concrete structures.
- d. Repair areas of erosion. Soil materials used in repairs will be of consistent and compatible characteristics with the surrounding materials and shall be compacted to a density equaling that of the undisturbed surrounding material.
- e. Obtain advance written permission of the Director of Public Works and Transportation of the City of Arlington BEFORE placing any improvements within the Easement.
- f. Upon request from the City, provide to the of the City of Arlington an annual written report, on or before January 31, specifically describing the operation and maintenance of the improvements for the preceding year. Said report shall include a description of procedures used, the names of persons responsible for each procedure, and the date of each procedure.
- g. Correct any condition of the improvements, or any maintenance deficiencies regarding the improvements, that the City reasonably believes to be necessary for the protection of the public health and safety. Such correction shall occur (or if impossible of completion within such time, shall begin) within thirty (30) days from the date the City gives written notice of the condition or deficiency to Grantor or its successors and assigns.

GRANTOR AND BENEFICIARY SHALL BE JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY LIABLE TO THE CITY FOR THE MAINTENANCE OBLIGATIONS, and in the event the Grantor does not perform the Maintenance Obligations, agrees: (a) that the City at its option may perform the Maintenance Obligations, and (b) to indemnify and hold harmless, to the extent allowed by law, the City for all City costs necessary to perform the Maintenance Obligations.

THIS AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.

THE PROVISIONS of this EASEMENT, RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS, AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT shall be deemed to be independent and severable, and the invalidity or partial invalidity of any provision or portion hereof does not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision.

GRANTOR DOES HEREBY COVENANT AND AGREE to WARRANT AND FOREVER DEFEND title to the Easement herein granted unto the City against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof subject to the matters set forth herein.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said Easement unto the City of Arlington and its successors and assigns in perpetuity.



Subject:	House Bill 3 (HB 3) and District Improvement Pla	n Progress Monitoring Update

Purpose:

To provide the Board of Trustees with an update on the Texas Academic Accountability system (including anticipated changes beginning the 2022-2023 school year) as well as a progress update pertaining to House Bill 3 (HB 3) and District Improvement Plan (DIP) targets as it relates to outcomes from the spring State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) benchmark.

Background:

The State of Texas utilizes an academic accountability system to provide annual academic ratings to each of its public schools. These ratings are based on data generated from indicators within that system such as student outcomes of the state standardized tests, graduation rates, college, career and military readiness, etc. The system seeks to examine student achievement within specified grade levels utilizing the STAAR, student academic and linguistic progress and the closure of achievement gaps with various student groups.

Additionally, in the spring of 2019, the 86th Legislature passed the finance bill, HB 3, which included specific requirements pertaining to goal setting and the progress monitoring process for improved outcomes in early childhood literacy and mathematics, as well as college, career, and military readiness (CCMR). The statute requires school boards to adopt plans that include annual goals for aggregate growth on 3rd grade reading and mathematics achievement, annual targets for closing achievement gaps among student groups, targeted professional development for classroom teachers and annual targets for students being served in bilingual and ESL programs. The bill also calls for aggregate annual goals and targets for CCMR readiness as evaluated under the state accountability system's student achievement domain and for each student group articulated in the closing the gaps domain.

This discussion item will provide both an update on changes to the state's academic accountability system and a progress check pertaining to student outcomes on the spring STAAR benchmark results for grades 3-11.
