Superintendent Term Contract

This Superintendent's Term Contract ("Contract") is entered into between the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Arlington Independent School District (the "District") and Dr. Matthew Smith (the "Superintendent").

The Board and the Superintendent, for and in consideration for the terms stated in this Contract, and pursuant to Chapter 11, Subchapters D and E, Section 11.201 and Chapter 21 of the Texas Education Code hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **Term.** The Board agrees to employ the Superintendent for a term beginning January 30, 2024 and ending June 30, 2027. The Board and the Superintendent (the "Parties") may extend the term of this Contract by agreement.
- 2. **Certification.** The Superintendent shall at all times during the term of this Contract, and any renewal or extension thereof, hold and maintain a valid certificate required of a superintendent by the State of Texas and issued by the State Board for Educator Certification and any other certificates required by law.
- 3. Representations. The Superintendent makes the following representations:
 - 3.1 **Beginning of Contract:** At the beginning of this Contract, and at any time during this Contract, the Superintendent specifically agrees to submit to a review of his or her national criminal history record information (NCHRI) if required by the District, TEA, or SBEC. The Superintendent understands that a criminal history record acceptable to the Board, at its sole discretion, is a condition precedent to this Contract.
 - 3.2 **During Contract:** The Superintendent also agrees that, during the term of this Contract, the Superintendent will notify the Board in writing of any arrest or of any charge, indictment, conviction, no contest or guilty plea, or other adjudication of the Superintendent for any felony, any offense involving moral turpitude, and any offenses set forth in Policy DH (Local), including any civil filings by or against the Superintendent in his personal capacity. The Superintendent agrees to provide such notification in writing within the period specified in Board Policy DH (Local).
 - 3.3 False Statements and Misrepresentations: The Superintendent represents that any records or information provided in connection with his or her employment application are true and correct. Any false statements, misrepresentations, omissions of requested information, intentionally made, or fraud by the Superintendent in or concerning any required records or in the employment application may be grounds for termination or nonrenewal, as applicable.
- 4. **Duties.** The Superintendent is the chief executive of the District and shall faithfully perform the duties of the Superintendent of Schools for the District as prescribed in the job description and as may be lawfully assigned by the Board, and shall comply with all lawful Board directives, state and federal law, district policy, rules, and regulations as they exist or may hereafter be amended. Specifically, it shall be the duty of the Superintendent to recommend

for employment all professional employees of the District subject to the Board's approval. It shall be the further duty of the Superintendent to employ all other personnel consistent with the Board's policies. It shall be the further duty of the Superintendent to direct, assign, reassign, and evaluate all of the employees of the District consistent with Board policies and federal and state law. It shall be the further duty of the Superintendent to organize, reorganize, and arrange the staff of the District, and to develop and establish administrative regulations, rules, and procedures that the Superintendent deems necessary for the efficient and effective operation of the District consistent with the Board's lawful directives, the Board's policies, and state and federal law. It shall be the further duty of the Superintendent to accept all resignations of employees of the District consistent with the Board's policies, except the Superintendent's resignation, which must be accepted by the Board. All duties assigned to the Superintendent by the Board shall be appropriate to and consistent with the professional role and responsibility of the Superintendent. The Superintendent agrees to perform his or her duties as follows:

- 4.1 **Authority:** The Board shall have the right to assign additional duties to the Superintendent and to make changes in responsibilities or work at any time during the contract term. All duties assigned by the Board shall be appropriate to and consistent with the professional role and responsibility of the Superintendent.
- 4.2 Standard: Except as otherwise permitted by this Contract, the Superintendent agrees to devote his or her full time and energy to the performance of his or her duties. The Superintendent shall perform his or her duties with reasonable care, skill, and diligence.
- 4.3 **Reassignment:** The Superintendent cannot be reassigned from the position of Superintendent to another position without the Superintendent's express written consent.
- 4.4 Outside Consultant Activities. With the prior written approval of the Board and in accordance with the Texas Education Code, Section 11.201(e), the Superintendent may serve as a consultant to other school districts or educational agencies, lecture, engage in writing activities and speaking engagements, and engage in other activities that are of a short-term duration and that do not interfere with the performance of his duties as Superintendent. The Superintendent shall use personal leave for any such consulting activities, and any expenses for such consulting activities shall not be paid or reimbursed by the District unless approved by the Board.
- 4.5 **Board Meetings**. The Superintendent shall attend all meetings of the Board, both public and closed, except for those closed meetings devoted to the consideration of any action or lack of action on the Superintendent's Contract, or the Superintendent's evaluation, or for purposes of resolving conflicts between individual Board members, or when the Board is acting in its capacity as a tribunal. In the event of illness or Board-approved absence, the Superintendent's designee may attend such meetings subject to the Board's approval. In accordance with section 11.051(a-1) of the Education Code, the Board shall provide the Superintendent an opportunity to provide verbal or written recommendation(s) and/or information as to each of the items of business considered and voted on by the Board at each Board meeting.

Indemnification. To the extent it may be permitted to do so by applicable law, including, but not limited to Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code Chapter 102, the District does hereby agree to defend, hold harmless, and indemnify the Superintendent from any and all demands, claims, suits, actions, judgments, expenses and attorneys' fees incurred in any legal proceedings brought against Superintendent in the Superintendent's individual or official capacity as an employee and as Superintendent of the District, providing the incident(s), which is (are) the basis of any such demand, claim, suits, actions, judgments, expenses and attorneys' fees, arose or does arise in the future from an act or omission of Superintendent as an employee of the District, acting within the course and scope of Superintendent's employment with the District ("Covered Claim"); excluding, however, any such demand, claim, suits, actions, judgments, expenses and attorneys' fees for those claims or any causes of action where it is determined that Superintendent committed official misconduct, or committed a willful or wrongful act or omission, or an act or omission constituting gross negligence, or acted in bad faith; and excluding any costs, fees, expenses or damages that would be recoverable or payable under an insurance contract, held either by the District or by Superintendent.

The selection of Superintendent's legal counsel shall be with the mutual agreement of the Superintendent and the District if such legal counsel is not also the District's legal counsel for any Covered Claim. A legal defense may be provided through insurance coverage, in which case the Superintendent's right to agree to legal counsel provided for him will depend on the terms of the applicable insurance contract. To the extent this Section 4.6 exceeds the authority provided and limitations imposed by Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code, Chapter 102, it shall be construed and modified accordingly. The provisions of this Section 4.6 shall survive the termination of this Contract.

- 5. Compensation. The District shall pay the Superintendent an annual salary as follows:
 - 5.1 Salary. The District shall pay the Superintendent an annual salary of THREE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$335,000.00), which amount, beginning July 1, 2025, shall be automatically increased each year by an amount equal to the highest percentage raise given to the District's teachers. The annual salary shall be paid to the Superintendent in equal monthly installments consistent with the Board's policies. At any time during the term of this Contract, the Board may, in its discretion, review and adjust the salary of the Superintendent, but in no event shall the Superintendent be paid less than the salary set forth in Section 5.1 of this Contract except by mutual agreement of the two parties or as permitted by law subject to any legal challenges by the Superintendent. Such adjustments, if any, shall be made pursuant to a lawful Board resolution. In such event, the parties agree to provide their best efforts and reasonable cooperation to execute a new contract incorporating the adjusted salary. Subject to and without waiving any Constitutional and/or other legal challenges by the Superintendent, the Superintendent acknowledges that the District may have certain rights pursuant to Education Code Sections 21.4021 and/or 21.4032.

- 5.2 **Benefits:** In addition to the benefits expressly set forth herein, the District shall provide other benefits to the Superintendent as provided to District employees by state law and Board policies including, without limitation, any stipends/bonuses/incentives provided to other administrative employees of the District. The Board reserves the right to amend its policies at any time during the term of this Contract to reduce or increase such other benefits not expressly provided herein, at the Board's sole discretion.
- 5.3 Civic Activities. The Superintendent is encouraged to participate in community and civic affairs. The Board concludes that such participation will serve a legitimate purpose related to the educational mission of the District. Prior to engaging in these activities, the Superintendent will notify the Board in writing of the activity. The Board will notify the Superintendent if the activity presents a conflict or interferes with the performance of his duties as Superintendent. The expense of these activities, subject to Board approval in advance, shall be borne by the District.
- **Professional Organizations.** The Superintendent shall devote the Superintendent's time, attention, and energy to the direction, administration, and supervision of the District. The Board, however, encourages the continued professional growth of the Superintendent through the Superintendent's active attendance and participation in appropriate professional meetings, seminars, conferences, or courses at the local, regional, state, and national level. Subject to Board approval and the District budget, the Board shall encourage the use of data and information sources, and shall encourage the participation of the Superintendent in pertinent education seminars and courses offered by public or private institutions or by educational associations, as well as the participation in informational meetings with those individuals whose particular skills, expertise, or backgrounds would serve to improve the capacity of the Superintendent to perform the Superintendent's professional responsibilities for the District. In its encouragement of the Superintendent to grow professionally, the Board shall permit a reasonable amount of release time for the Superintendent as the Superintendent and the Board deem appropriate, to attend such meetings, seminars, conferences, or courses. The District does hereby agree to provide in the District's budget per contract year an amount to be used for registration, travel, meals, lodging, and other related expenses. The District shall pay for the Superintendent's membership dues to the Texas Association of School Administrators and one other professional organization selected by the Superintendent. The District shall pay for other memberships necessary to maintain and improve the Superintendent's professional skills, subject to Board approval and the District's budget. The District shall bear the reasonable cost and expense for registration, travel, meals, lodging, and other related expenses for such attendance and membership.
- 5.5 **Residence in District.** The Superintendent shall have until August 1, 2024 to establish a residence in the District, and shall establish temporary housing in the District no later than his start date under this Contract. The Board and Superintendent may modify these timeframes by mutual agreement in writing. As a condition of employment with the Arlington Independent School District, the Superintendent shall reside within the geographic boundaries of the District at all other times while employed as Superintendent by the District.

- 5.6 Relocation/Moving Expenses. In connection with the necessary relocation of the Superintendent and the Superintendent's family to the District, the District shall pay the Superintendent, the sum of \$15,000.00 within five days following the start date of this Contract. This moving and relocation expense allowance is paid in lieu of any other compensation or reimbursement for the cost and expense of moving the Superintendent's family and belongings to the District and/or the cost and expense of temporary housing. The Superintendent shall be responsible for and shall pay any taxes due on this allowance and applicable taxes will be deducted from the \$15,000 payment by the District.
- Leave Days, Vacation and Holidays: The Superintendent may take, at the Superintendent's choice, the greater of (i) ten (10) days of vacation annually or (ii) the same number of days of vacation authorized by policies adopted by the Board for administrators on twelve-month contracts, the days to be taken in a single period or at different times. The vacation days taken by the Superintendent will be taken at such time or times as will least interfere with the performance of the Superintendent's duties as set forth in this Contract. Accrued but unused vacation days shall accumulate and carry forward from year to year during the term of this Contract. At the sole option of the Superintendent, on or before the end of each year of the term of this Contract, the District shall pay in a lump sum to the Superintendent any accrued but unused vacation days, up to an annual maximum of 2 days, at the Superintendent's daily rate of pay as of the payment date. The daily rate shall be calculated by dividing the Superintendent's TRS creditable compensation by 226. The Superintendent shall observe the same holidays and breaks as provided for other 12-month administrators in the Board's adopted annual calendar and shall be eligible for any other leave (i.e., state and local) available to other employees under Board policy. The Superintendent shall schedule leave days with prior written notice to the Board President and at times that will least interfere with the performance of the Superintendent's duties.
- Liability Insurance: The District's Professional Liability insurance policy provides coverage for the Superintendent, as set forth in the policy, and this policy or one with similar coverage will be kept in full force and effect during the term of this Contract and shall be maintained for a sufficient period to provide coverage for claims raised after the term of the Contract but which arose form acts during the Contract term. During the term of this Contract, the Superintendent shall fully cooperate with the District in the defense of any and all claims, demands, suits, actions and legal proceedings brought against the District. After termination of this Contract, the Superintendent agrees to provide assistance to and cooperate with the District, its Board, Trustees, agents, and attorneys in response to, or in defense of, any demand, claim, complaint, suit, action or legal proceeding brought against the District, Board, its Trustees, or agents, arising from any acts or events alleged to have occurred during the term of the Superintendent's employment with the District, at no additional expense to the District other than reimbursement to the Superintendent for his documented reasonable and necessary out-of-pocket expenses, plus the greater of (1) an amount equal to any salary lost by the Superintendent by virtue of taking time off from his then current employment to assist the District, or (2) an amount equal to the Superintendent's last daily rate while employed by the District, for each day the

Superintendent is requested to provide assistance to the District. Requests for assistance from the Superintendent with respect to such matters shall be made through the Board President, any successor superintendent, and/or legal counsel for the District. The Superintendent will not be reimbursed for any expenses related to a lawsuit brought by him or on his behalf against the District, the Board, any trustee or any District employee.

- 5.9 **Life and Health Insurance**. The District shall pay the same premiums for hospitalization, major medical and dental insurance coverage for the Superintendent as it does for other administrative employees of the District pursuant to the group health care plan provided by the District for its administrative employees. The District shall reimburse the Superintendent for a life insurance policy designated by the Superintendent, up to a total annual premium of \$3,600.00.
- 5.10 Supplemental Retirement Plan—Deferral. Annually during the term of this Contract, the District shall add to the Salary of the Superintendent the amount of fortyfive percent (45%) of the annual maximum voluntary contribution allowable under Section 402(g) of the Code for a 403(b) and 457(b) Plan, at the beginning of the Contract year, as indexed, including the age 50 catch-up, if applicable ("Additional Salary"). One-twelfth of this amount shall be paid as a monthly salary deferral contribution, at the election of the Superintendent, to a plan established by the District under Section 403(b) and/or Section 457(b) of the Code. In the event the Superintendent executes a salary deferral agreement in accordance with the requirements of Sections 403(b) and/or 457(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") in at least the amount of the Additional Salary, the Additional Salary shall be paid as a salary deferral contribution ("Salary Deferral Contribution"). Under and pursuant to applicable Internal Revenue Service rules the Superintendent shall have the option to elect to receive the Additional Salary in cash rather than as a Salary Deferral Contribution. All such Salary Deferral Contributions contemplated herein shall be paid to a plan that is (i) established by the District under Section 403(b) and/or Section 457(b) of the Code; and (ii) available to all TRS members employed by the District. Such plans shall include investments as allowed under Sections 403(b), 403(b)(7) and/or 457(b) of the Code, respectively, and the investments for the Superintendent's accounts shall be solely at his discretion. The Superintendent shall always be 100% vested in his account under the 403(b) and/or 457(b) plan. The Salary Deferral Contributions contemplated herein shall be treated as salary deferrals under the Code and shall be reported as "creditable compensation" by the District for purposes of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas. No payments under this Section shall be made after the Superintendent's employment terminates.
- 5.11 Supplemental Retirement-ER Paid. Beginning on or before December 31, 2024, and on or before each December 31st thereafter during the Term of this Contract, including any extensions thereof, the District shall contribute to the Supplemental Retirement Plan an amount equal to 5% of the contribution limit for employer contributions to a 403(b) plan and a 401(a) plan under Section 415(c) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"), as indexed each year, less the maximum voluntary salary reduction contributions permitted by the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") for a 403(b) plan. If the Contract is terminated for any reason prior to December 31st of a year in which

the contribution under this section has not been made, the District shall make the contribution on or before the date of termination.

The Supplemental Retirement Plan shall consist of an employer paid 403(b) plan, a 457(b) deferred compensation plan and a 401(a) defined contribution plan. Any payments to the Supplemental Retirement Plan as provided in this section shall be made as employer paid non-elective contributions to the plans unless such payments exceed the limits under the Code, as described herein. Contributions to the Supplemental Retirement Plan shall first be made to a Board paid plan established under Section 403(b) of the Code. To the extent that such contribution exceeds the employer paid contribution limit under the Code for a 403(b) plan, the remaining contribution shall be made to a defined contribution plan established under Section 401(a) of the Code. To the extent that the remaining contribution exceeds the contribution limit for the 401(a) plan, then the Superintendent shall have the right to elect to receive the funds as cash or as an elective deferral to a 403(b) or 457(b) plan.

Each plan shall provide that the contributions made to the plan and all earnings thereon shall at all times be fully vested in the Superintendent. Each of these plans shall be established under a written plan document that meets the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") and such documents are hereby incorporated herein by reference. The funds for the plans shall be invested in such investment vehicles as are allowable under the Code for the applicable type of plan and such investment vehicles shall be chosen solely by the Superintendent.

- 5.12 Texas Teacher Retirement System. For performance of Superintendent duties, the District shall supplement the Superintendent's salary by an amount equal to the Superintendent's portion of the member contribution to the Texas Teacher Retirement System ("TRS") during the Term of this Contract, including any extensions thereof. This salary supplement shall include both the retirement and TRS-Care parts of the TRS member contribution, as applicable but shall not be limited by Internal Revenue Code (IRC) §401(a)(17)(A). In other words, for purposes of calculating the amount of supplemental salary under this section, the supplemental salary shall be calculated as if the Superintendent entered the TRS System prior to September 1, 1996. This additional salary supplement for services rendered shall be paid to the Superintendent in regular monthly payroll installments and shall be reported as "creditable compensation" by the District for purposes of TRS, to the extent permitted by TRS.
- 5.13 Expenses. The District shall reimburse the Superintendent for out-of-district travel incurred by the Superintendent in the continuing performance of the Superintendent's duties under this Contract at the standard mileage rate per mile as established by the Internal Revenue Service during each year of this Contract. The District shall pay or reimburse the Superintendent for reasonable expenses incurred by the Superintendent in the continuing performance of the Superintendent's duties under this Contract. The District agrees to pay the actual and incidental costs incurred by the Superintendent for travel. Such actual or incidental costs may include, but are not limited to, hotels and accommodations, meals, rental car, and other expenses incurred in the performance of the business of the District. The Superintendent shall comply with all procedures and documentation requirements in accordance with Board policies.

6. **Suspension.** In accordance with Texas Education Code chapter 21, the Board may suspend the Superintendent without pay during the term of this Contract for good cause as determined by the Board.

7. Termination and Nonrenewal of Contract.

7.1 **Extension/Nonrenewal**. Extension and/or nonrenewal shall be in accordance with Board policy, Texas Education Code Chapter 21, Subchapter E, and applicable law.

7.2 Termination.

- 7.2.1 **Mutual Agreement**. This Contract may be terminated by the mutual agreement of the Superintendent and the Board in writing upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.
- 7.2.2 **Retirement or Death**. This Contract shall be terminated upon the retirement or death of the Superintendent.
- 7.2.3 **Dismissal for Good Cause**. The Board may dismiss the Superintendent during the term of the Contract for good cause in accordance with applicable law.
- 7.2.4 **Termination Procedure.** If the Board proposes to suspend without pay or terminate this Contract for "good cause," the Superintendent shall be afforded all the rights as set forth in the Board's policies and state and federal law.
- 7.2.5 **Resignation of Superintendent**. The Superintendent may leave the employment of the District at the end of a school year without penalty by filing a written resignation with the Board. The resignation must be addressed to the Board and filed not later than the 60th day before the first day of instruction of the following year. The Superintendent may resign with the consent of the Board at any other time.

8. General Provisions.

- 8.1 Amendment: This Contract may not be amended except by written agreement of the Parties.
- 8.2 **Severability:** If any provision in this Contract is, for any reason, held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of the Contract. This Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been a part of the Contract.
- 8.3 Entire Agreement: All existing agreements and contracts, both verbal and written, between the Parties regarding the employment of the Superintendent for the term stated herein are superseded by this Contract. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties.

- 8.4 Applicable Law and Venue: Texas law shall govern construction of this Contract. The Parties agree that venue for any litigation relating to the Superintendent's employment with the District, including this Contract, shall be the county in which the District's administration building is located. If litigation is brought in federal court, the Parties agree that venue shall be the federal district and division in which the district's administration building is located.
- 8.5 **Paragraph Headings:** The headings used at the beginning of each numbered paragraph in this Contract are not intended to have any legal effect; the headings do not limit or expand the meaning of the paragraphs that follow them.
- 8.6 Legal Representation: Both Parties have been represented by legal counsel of their choice, or have had the opportunity to consult with legal counsel, in the negotiation and execution of this Contract.
- 8.7 Conflicts. In the event of any conflict between the terms, conditions, and provisions of this Contract and the provisions of the Board's policies, or any permissive state or federal law, then, unless otherwise prohibited by law, the terms of this Contract shall take precedence over the contrary provisions of the Board's policies or any such permissive law during the term of the Contract, except as noted in paragraph 5.1 in accordance with Education Code Sections 21.4021 and/or 21.4032 subject to any legal challenges by the Superintendent.

9. Notices.

- 9.1 **To Superintendent:** The Superintendent agrees to keep a current address on file with the District's human resources office and the Board President. The Superintendent agrees that the Board may meet any legal obligation it has to give the Superintendent written notice regarding this Contract or the Superintendent's employment by hand-delivery, or by certified mail, regular mail, and/or express delivery service to the Superintendent's address of record.
- 9.2 **To Board:** The Board agrees that the Superintendent may meet any legal obligation to give the Board written notice regarding this Contract or the Superintendent's employment by providing one copy of the notice to the President of the Board, one copy to the Vice President of the Board, and one copy to the Secretary of the Board. The Superintendent may provide such notices by hand delivery, or by certified mail, regular mail, and/or express delivery service, to the Board President, Vice President, and Secretary's addresses of record, as provided to the District.

10. Annual Performance Goals.

10.1 **Development of Goals**. The Superintendent shall submit to the Board a preliminary list of goals for the District each year for the Board's consideration and adoption. The Superintendent and the Board shall then meet, and the Board shall approve or revise the list of goals. The Superintendent shall submit to the Board for its approval a plan to implement the goals. The Superintendent and the Board shall meet biannually to assess the goals and may adjust or revise the goals either by action of the Board or upon

recommendation of the Superintendent and approval of the Board. The goals approved by the Board shall be reduced to writing ("District Goals") and shall be among the criteria on which the Superintendent's performance is reviewed and evaluated. The District Goals approved by the Board shall be specific, definitive, and measurable, to the extent feasible. The Board agrees to work with and support the Superintendent in achieving the District Goals.

11. Review of Performance.

- 11.1 Time and Basis of Evaluation. The Board shall evaluate and assess in writing the performance of the Superintendent at least once each year during the term of this Contract. The Superintendent's evaluation instrument and process shall be developed and/or revised with input from the Superintendent. The Board's evaluation and assessment of the Superintendent shall be reasonably related to the duties of the Superintendent as outlined in the Superintendent's job description and shall be based on the District's progress towards accomplishing the District Goals.
- 11.2 Confidentiality. Unless the Superintendent expressly requests otherwise in writing, the evaluation of the Superintendent shall, at all times be conducted in executive session and shall be considered confidential to the extent permitted by law. Nothing herein shall prohibit the Board or the Superintendent from sharing the content of the Superintendent's evaluation with their respective legal counsel.
- 11.3 Evaluation Format and Procedures. The evaluation format and procedure shall be in accordance with the evaluation instrument selected by the Board in accordance with the provisions of Section 11 of this Contract, the Board's policies and state and federal law. In the event the Board deems that the evaluation instrument, format, and/or procedure is to be modified by the Board and such modifications would require new or different performance expectations, such modifications must be adopted with input from the Superintendent and the Superintendent shall be provided a reasonable period to demonstrate such expected performance before being evaluated.
- 12. Authority. The Board of Trustees have been authorized to execute this Contract on behalf of the District by action of a majority of a quorum of the Trustees present at a properly called and posted meeting on _______.
